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# Animal Health Regulations for All Sullivan County Fair Exhibitors

## IMPORTANT: ALL HEALTH PAPERS MUST BE CHECKED BEFORE UNLOADING

Be sure to use only grooming products that are approved for use on meat and dairy animals when fitting your animals for show. Unapproved products may contain ingredients that result in unacceptable residues in the meat or milk. If you are not certain that a product is residue safe and approved for use on meat or dairy animals, do not use it!

**\*\*Important!\*\*** If upon slaughter, treatment with drugs, biologics or any chemical for fitting products, is the cause of condemnation of a carcass, the loss of the carcass and any other damages will be borne by the exhibitor.

## EQUINE ANIMALS

1. A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) issued within the 30 days prior to the opening date of the exhibition is required. Equine Infectious Anemia (EIA) test results and date of the test must be included on the CVI.
2. All animals must be free of infectious and contagious diseases and a statement of this is required on the CVI (the statement is pre-printed on the CVI). Animals appearing unhealthy upon arrival may not enter the exhibition grounds.
3. An Animal Owner or Caretaker's Verification of Veterinarian-Client-Patient Relationship (VCPR) form must accompany each animal, and must be presented upon arrival at the exhibition.
4. All equine animals must have tested negative for EIA by an official test within the 12 months prior to the opening date of the exhibition. A copy of the official test results must accompany each animal to its final destination. Foals less than 6 months of age accompanied by a dam which meets the above requirements are exempt from EIA testing requirements. If the foal is not accompanied by the dam, a copy of the dam's test results must accompany the foal to its final destination.
5. A current rabies vaccination administered by a licensed veterinarian is required for animals 3 months of age and older. All vaccine label directions must be followed, and all rabies vaccinated equine animals must be accompanied by a rabies vaccination certificate or the vaccination information must be included on the CVI. If a rabies vaccination certificate is provided, the certificate must contain legible name and contact information of the veterinarian who administered the vaccine and the veterinarian's signature. A copy of the rabies vaccination certificate is acceptable.

## PENNSYLVANIA POULTRY, WATERFOWL, UPLAND GAME BIRDS, RATITES, AND PIGEONS:

1. All Pennsylvania poultry, waterfowl, upland game birds, and pigeons entering an exhibition must bear a unique individual identification leg band (official state-issued leg bands are not required). Ratites must be identified with a neck band or an electronic implant device (the exhibitor must supply a reader).
2. An owner-endorsed health certificate must accompany all Pennsylvania poultry, waterfowl, upland game birds, ratites, and pigeons, and must include the following:
  - Name and location of exhibition; and
  - Name, address, and telephone number of the owner; and
  - A statement that their entries and their flock of origin are free of evidence of contagious diseases; and
  - Owner signature and date of that signature; and
  - Verification of testing for AI and Pullorum.
3. All animals must be free of infectious and contagious diseases. Animals appearing unhealthy upon arrival may not enter the exhibition grounds.
4. Avian Influenza Clean Testing and Verification (all samples must be collected by a Certified Poultry Technician or an Accredited Veterinarian):
  - All poultry, waterfowl, upland game birds, and ratites, (pigeons excluded) for exhibition must originate from a flock in good standing in the Pennsylvania Avian Influenza Monitored Flock program, or from a flock in good standing in the NPIP Avian Influenza Clean program;

OR

- The birds must originate from a flock in which a minimum of 30 birds, 3 weeks of age or older, were tested negative for avian influenza within the 6 months prior to the opening date of the exhibition. The following age restrictions apply to comply with NPIP standards:
  - Chickens shall be tested at 4 months of age or older.
  - Turkeys shall be tested at 12 weeks of age or older.
  - Game birds shall be tested at 4 months of age or older, or upon sexual maturity, whichever comes first.
  - Ratites shall be tested at 12 months of age or older.
  - All birds not meeting these age restrictions are exempt from pullorum testing requirements.

5. Pullorum-Typhoid Clean Testing and Verification (pigeons and waterfowl excluded). (All samples must be collected by a Certified Poultry Technician or an Accredited Veterinarian):

- All poultry, upland game birds, and ratites (pigeons and waterfowl excluded) must originate from a flock in good standing in the NPIP Pullorum-Typhoid Clean Program or from a flock in good standing in the PA Pullorum Equivalent Program;

OR

- Individual birds must be tested for pullorum typhoid within 30 days of the opening date of the exhibition. The following age restrictions apply to comply with NPIP standards:
  - Chickens shall be tested at 4 months of age or older.
  - Turkeys shall be tested at 12 weeks of age or older.
  - Game birds shall be tested at 4 months of age or older, or upon sexual maturity, whichever comes first.
  - Ratites shall be tested at 12 months of age or older.
  - All birds not meeting these age restrictions are exempt from pullorum testing requirements.

## PENNSYLVANIA SWINE

1. A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) issued within the 30 days prior to the opening date of the exhibition is required.
2. All animals must be free of infectious and contagious diseases and a statement of this is required on the CVI (the statement is pre-printed on the CVI). Animals appearing unhealthy upon arrival may not enter the exhibition grounds.
3. An Animal Owner or Caretaker's Verification of Veterinarian-Client-Patient Relationship (VCPR) form must accompany each animal, and must be presented upon arrival at the exhibition.
4. Individual animal ID is required. ID options include the following:
  - A form of official identification tag); or
  - A plastic stamped ear tag.

## PENNSYLVANIA CATTLE

1. A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) issued within the 30 days prior to the opening date of the exhibition is required.
2. All animals must be free of infectious and contagious diseases and a statement of this is required on the CVI (the statement is pre-printed on the CVI). Animals appearing unhealthy upon arrival may not enter the exhibition grounds.
3. An Animal Owner or Caretaker's Verification of Veterinarian-Client-Patient Relationship (VCPR) form must accompany each animal, and must be presented upon arrival at the exhibition.
4. Individual official animal identification is required. Official ID includes:
  - A state-issued metal ear tag; or
  - An ISO-compliant RFID tag; or
  - A state-registered tattoo.
5. A current rabies vaccination administered by a licensed veterinarian is required for animals 3 months of age and older (market cattle are exempt from this vaccination requirement). All vaccine label directions must be followed, and all rabies vaccinated cattle must be accompanied by a rabies vaccination certificate or the vaccination information must be included on the CVI. If a rabies vaccination certificate is provided, the certificate must contain legible name and contact information of the veterinarian who administered the vaccine and the veterinarian's signature. A copy of the rabies vaccination certificate is acceptable.

## GOATS

1. A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) issued within the 30 days prior to the opening date of the exhibition is required.
2. All animals must be free of infectious and contagious diseases and a statement of this is required on the CVI (the statement is pre-printed on the CVI). Animals appearing unhealthy upon arrival may not enter the exhibition grounds.
3. An Animal Owner or Caretaker's Verification of Veterinarian-Client-Patient Relationship (VCPR) form must accompany each animal, and must be presented upon arrival at the exhibition.
4. Individual official animal identification is required. Official ID includes:
  - A scrapie eartag. Contact the USDA to obtain scrapie eartags at 1-866-873-2824, weekdays from 9 AM to 5 PM. Your order may take several weeks for processing, so order tags early; or
  - An ISO-compliant RFID tag; or
  - A scrapie tattoo. Goats with an official scrapie tattoo must also have a unique individual animal ID (tattoo) to meet the scrapie ID requirement; or
  - Goats having a breed registration tattoo and accompanied by a registration certificate are exempt from the scrapie ID requirement if the tattoo is legible and a registration certificate (copy acceptable) or a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection which lists the tattoo and registry accompanies the animal at all times during transport from the premises of birth.

## SHEEP

1. A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) issued within the 30 days prior to the opening date of the exhibition is required.
2. All animals must be free of infectious and contagious diseases and a statement of this is required on the CVI (the statement is pre-printed on the CVI). Animals appearing unhealthy upon arrival may not enter the exhibition grounds.
3. An Animal Owner or Caretaker's Verification of Veterinarian-Client-Patient Relationship (VCPR) form must accompany each animal, and must be presented upon arrival at the exhibition.
4. Individual official USDA scrapie animal identification is required. Official scrapie ID includes:
  - A scrapie eartag. Contact the USDA to obtain scrapie eartags at 1-866-873-2824, weekdays from 9 AM to 5 PM. Your order may take several weeks for processing, so order tags early; or
  - A scrapie tattoo with individual animal ID (tattoo); or
  - An ISO-compliant RFID tag.
5. A current rabies vaccination administered by a licensed veterinarian is required for animals 3 months of age and older (market sheep are exempt from this vaccination requirement). All vaccine label directions must be followed, and all rabies vaccinated sheep must be accompanied by a rabies vaccination certificate or the vaccination information must be included on the CVI. If a rabies vaccination certificate is provided, the certificate must contain legible name and contact information of the veterinarian who administered the vaccine and the veterinarian's signature. A copy of the rabies vaccination certificate is acceptable.

## PENNSYLVANIA RABBITS

1. An Animal Owner or Caretaker's Verification of Veterinarian-Client-Patient Relationship (VCPR) form must accompany all PA rabbits, and must be presented upon arrival at the exhibition.
2. All animals must be free of infectious and contagious diseases. Animals appearing unhealthy upon arrival may not enter the exhibition grounds.

## PENNSYLVANIA CAMELIDS

1. A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) issued within the 30 days prior to the opening date of the exhibition is required.
2. All animals must be free of infectious and contagious diseases and a statement of this is required on the CVI (the statement is pre-printed on the CVI). Animals appearing unhealthy upon arrival may not enter the exhibition grounds.
3. An Animal Owner or Caretaker's Verification of Veterinarian-Client-Patient Relationship (VCPR) form must accompany each animal, and must be presented upon arrival at the exhibition.
4. Individual official animal identification is required. Official ID includes:
  - An ISO-compliant RFID tag; or
  - A state-registered tattoo; or
  - An electronic implant device (the exhibitor must supply a reader); or
  - An official state-issued metal ear tag.

## PENNSYLVANIA CERVIDS FOR EXHIBITION, INCLUDING COMMERCIAL EXHIBITION:

1. A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection issued within the 30 days prior to the opening date of the exhibition is required.
2. All animals must be free of infectious and contagious diseases and a statement of this is required on the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) (the statement is pre-printed on the CVI). Animals appearing unhealthy upon arrival may not enter the exhibition grounds.
3. An Animal Owner or Caretaker's Verification of Veterinarian-Client-Patient Relationship (VCPR) form must accompany each animal, and must be presented upon arrival at the exhibition.
4. Individual official animal identification is required. Official ID includes:
  - An ISO-compliant RFID tag; or
  - A state-registered tattoo; or
  - An electronic implant device (the exhibitor must supply a reader); or
  - An official state-issued metal ear tag.
5. Chronic Wasting Disease (CWD):

All CWD-susceptible species captive herds must be enrolled in the Pennsylvania CWD-certified Program to be eligible for exhibition. Verification of CWD-certified Program participation must accompany the animal. Animals on the Pennsylvania Monitored Herd Program are not eligible for exhibition.

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## Animal Owner or Caretaker's Verification of Veterinarian-Client-Patient Relationship

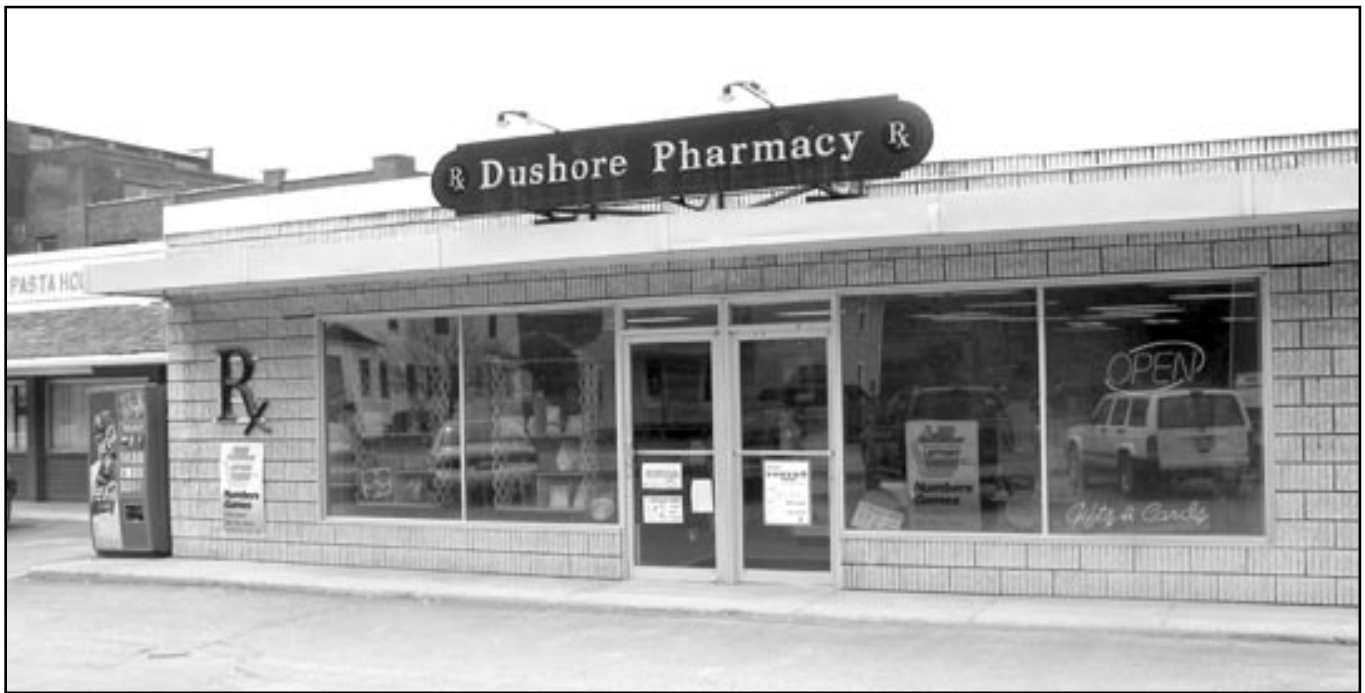

- A. The Sullivan County Fair is requiring that all horses coming on the grounds during the Fair for exhibition or otherwise be vaccinated with an approved Rabies vaccine. A certificate of vaccination showing name of vaccine, identification of animal, and signature of an accredited veterinarian must be presented upon entry to the grounds.
- B. Present the completed "Animal Owner or Caretaker's Verification of Veterinarians - Client - Patient Relationship upon arrival.

**SECTION 1- One Day Horse Show**

No Pulling Shoes For Classes 1-10

**RULES**

1. Each exhibitor is limited to two entries in classes 1 thru 10.
2. Drive  allowed in any of the classes below.
3. Scoring for Hitch Classes as follows:  
60% Manners and Performance  
20% Conformation  
20% Appointments (harness and cart)
5. Youth age is determined by participants who have not reached their 19th birthday by the time of the show.
6. Age of horse is determined by Jan. 1.
7. All youth drivers must be accompanied by an adult.
8. Attendants for hitch classes will be allowed in the ring only at the area in front of the gate for emergencies only.
9. No Stallions allowed in Youth Showmanship.
10. No Scotch Collars or Patent leather show harnesses will be allowed in Farm Class.
11. Two-wheel cart to be used in one-horse cart classes.
12. Entry fee is \$2.00 per horse.

**SECTION 2- HORSE PULLING RULES**

Chairman Sherman Higley (570) 924-3105

1. All horses shall be weighed for respective classes. Medium weight team-under 3300 lbs. Open class team-over 3300 lbs.
2. A full distance pull shall be 16 1/2 feet and any movement of the boat by a team after the driver has given the command for the team to go shall be called a pull and each team shall be allowed three (3) tries to make a full 16 1/2 ft. pull. If after three (3) tries the team has not pulled the 16 1/2 ft., they shall not go on to the next weight.
3. The track shall be 12 feet wide and shall so be marked. If a team steps on or crosses the line, on either side, that pull shall be disqualified and have to take his next pull in order.
4. The team shall not be changed or replaced during a pull, or the driver. If done, that team shall not be allowed to continue the contest. Driver may, however, change sides with his horses, time permitting.
5. Any slapping of any kind to the horse shall disqualify that pull.
6. Behavior of all horseman (drivers and helpers alike) to be above reproach at all times or DISCIPLINARY ACTION BY THE JUDGES WILL BE TAKEN. ANYONE DISPUTING THE DECISION OF THE JUDGES WILL BE IMMEDIATELY DISQUALIFIED.
7. The driver and no more than four (4) helpers will be allowed to any one team- with absolutely no heading!
8. Each team has three attempts to qualify each load. You must make an attempt to make a pull and get a distance on your 1st or 2nd pull, if you do not you automatically forfeit your 3rd pull. (At judges discretion.)
9. There will be a time limit of three (3) minutes from the time the announcer calls for that team to start to pull. If the team fails to start to pull in three (3) minutes, they will be disqualified and pull the next pull in order. If disqualified in the third pull, the team is out of the contest.
10. From the time the distance is measured and the stake is moved up, one minute will be allowed between first and second pull, otherwise contestant forfeits second pull, (teams may unhook within the time limit.)
11. On final pull- team may hook on either end if room for full pull or boat will be spotted in center of track.
12. In case contestant is late, he must start pulling at present weight being pulled.

13. Judges decision shall be final!
14. No pony will be eligible to pull in horse pulling contest.
15. No horses or ponies showing evidence of any contagious or infectious disease will be permitted entry to the fair. All horses to be exhibited at Pennsylvania fairs that are receiving State funds must be accompanied by a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection prepared within 30 days of the opening date of the fair by an accredited Veterinarian. The Health Certificate shall include the negative date of the Coggins test which has been conducted within twelve months of an opening date of the fair at which the horse is to be exhibited. The Sullivan County Fair is requiring that all horses coming on the grounds during the fair exhibition otherwise be vaccinated with an approved Rabies vaccine. A certificate of vaccination showing name of vaccine, identification of animal, and signature of an accredited veterinarian must be presented upon entry to the grounds.
16. Driver and one (1) helper admitted with entry.
17. Entry fee for teams \$10.00.
18. Entry fee for single horse \$5.00.
19. **Premium checks will be mailed.**
20. Drivers & Helpers will wear wristbands and are the only people allowed in pulling arena. No one else will be allowed in pulling arena. All spectators must be in the grandstand and be behind the railing. No abusive language will be tolerated from spectators and those offending will be escorted from the fairgrounds. No consumption of alcoholic beverages will be tolerated.
21. The Fair reserves the right to have a veterinarian on the grounds and to have horses blood tested.

### SECTION 3- PONY PULLING RULES

Chairman- K. Michael Norton (570) 924-4976

1. All ponies will be weighed for their respective classes.
2. A full distance pull shall be 10 feet and any movement of the boat by a team after the driver has given the command for the team to go shall be called a pull and each team shall be allowed three (3) tries to make a full 10 foot pull. If after three (3) tries the team has not pulled the 10 feet they shall not go on to the next weight.
3. The track shall be 12 feet wide and shall so be marked. If a team steps on or crosses the line, either pony on either side, that pull shall be disqualified and take his next pull in order.
4. The team shall not be changed or replaced during a pull, or the driver. If done, that team shall not be allowed to continue the contest.
5. Slapping of any kind to the ponies shall disqualify that pull.
6. Behavior of the horseman (drivers and helpers alike) to be above reproach at all times or DISCIPLINARY ACTION BY THE JUDGES WILL BE TAKEN. ANYONE DISPUTING THE DECISION OF THE JUDGES WILL BE IMMEDIATELY DISQUALIFIED.
7. The driver and no more than two (2) helpers will be allowed to any one team with absolutely no heading.
8. When the name of a team has been announced to pull, that team shall have two (2) minutes to start to pull before being disqualified for that pull. In the event that the team is disqualified on the 3rd pull that team will be out of the contest.
9. If a team fails to pull the required distance on a first pull, and the driver wants to take his second pull, he must do so before he unhooks from the boat. If he unhooks from the boat, he must take his second pull in order.
10. On third and final pull, the boat will be pulled to the middle and can be hooked on either end.
11. In event contestant is late, he must start pulling in pony pulling contest at weight posted.
12. No horse will be eligible to pull in pony pulling contest.
13. See Rule NO. 15 horse pulling.
14. Driver and one (1) helper admitted with entry.
15. Entry fee \$5.00.
16. **Premium checks will be mailed.**
17. Drivers and helpers will wear wristbands and are the only people allowed in pulling arena. No one else will be allowed in pulling arena. All spectators must be in the grandstand and be behind the railing. No abusive language will be tolerated from spectators and those offending will be escorted from the fairgrounds. No consumption of alcoholic beverages will be tolerated.
18. The Fair reserves the right to have a veterinarian on the grounds and to have ponies blood tested.

**SECTION 1**

**Dairy Cattle**

(Refer to General Rules, Health Rules on Page 10)

- 1. Exh  out controversy; to keep their animals in an attractive appearance; and to cooperate with the department in every way that may serve to increase the educational value of the show.
- 2. Ex  to  won by animals at show shall be prohibited until after awards have been made in their respective classes by the judges.
- 3. Exhibitors must have all animals listed for competition on the grounds not later than 4:00 p.m. on Wednesday, September 2, 2009. All such animals shall remain on the premises until Monday until 1:00 p.m.
- 4. Th  as promptly as the Superintendent may direct.

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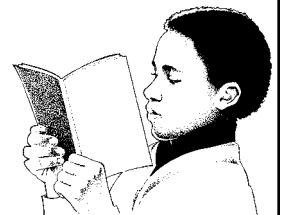
